Prayer for Our Government

Abridged form of a prayer by Archbishop Carroll in 1800.

We pray Thee Almighty and Eternal God, who through Jesus Christ has revealed Thy Glory to all nations, to preserve the works of Thy mercy; that Thy Church being spread through the whole world, may continue with unchanging faith, in the the confession of Thy name. We pray Thee, O God of might, wisdom and justice, through whom all authority is rightly administered, laws are enacted, and judgment decreed, assist with Thy Holy Spirit of counsel and fortitude, the president of these United States that his administration may be conducted in rightness, and be eminently useful to Thy people, over whom he presides, by encouraging due respect for virtue and religion; by a faithful execution of the laws in justice and mercy; and by restraining vice and immorality.

Let the light of Thy divine wisdom direct the deliberations of of the Congress and shine forth in all proceedings and laws framed for our rule and government; so that they may tend to the preservation of peace, the promotion of national happiness, the increase of industry, sobriety and useful knowledge, and may perpetuate in us the blessing of equal liberty.

We pray for our Governor, and for members of the Assembly, for all judges, magistrates and other officers who are appointed to guard our political welfare; that they may be enabled, by Thy powerful protection, to discharge the duties of their respective stations with honesty and ability. We likewise recommend to Thy unbounded mercy all our brethren and fellow citizens, throughout the United States that they may be blessed with the knowledge and sanctified in the observance of Thy most holy law; that they may be preserved in union, and in that peace which the world cannot give; and after enjoying the blessings of life be admitted to those that are eternal.
