2025 On the Employment of Time

“God allows us ample time to do good. But when this time, of which we are now the masters, shall be ended, we can no longer have a single moment at our disposal: ‘Time shall be no longer.’ (Apoc. X).

It is then that Our Lord’s time will have arrived, That time which He has fixed, and then He will ask how we have employed that which He had given. Ah! What a severe account will He not demand!

“Let us examine ourselves and see how we employ our time. Is it employed in useful things, or is it frittered away in seeking after vain pursuits?

“God gives us this time in order that it may assist us in working out our own salvation. The loss of your time does not produce a less evil than the eternal loss of your soul. ... “Even those who are in Heaven, would they not deem it an inestimable favor, if they had another day to merit some new degree of holiness which would unite them more closely to God?

“Why should we not make use of this short time in a similar way? ...“How sad for those who have lost, perhaps, every day of the year!

“How have we employed each day? We have worked hard for the world or have we gained much for Heaven? For if we have done nothing for eternity, we have lost a year. Now at least let us usefully make use of the little time that remains.”
