Our Lady of Prompt Succor

The feast of Our Lady of Prompt Succor is very special in the United States since this statue is the most famous miraculous image in America. In 1727, French Ursuline Sisters founded a convent and schools in New Orleans, Louisiana. By 1803, Mother Andre Madier asked Mother St. Michael in France to send more Sisters to assist. When the bishop, short-handed because of the French Revolution, rejected the request, Mother St. Michael appealed to the pope, who was a prisoner of Napoleon at that time. Mother St. Michael promised Our Lady that if she obtained a prompt answer, she would honor her in New Orleans under the title of Our Lady of Prompt Succor.

The Mother Superior sent her letter to the pope on March 19, 1809 and received a favorable reply on April 29, 1809. She then traveled to New Orleans with several younger Sisters and a newly fashioned statue of Our Lady of Prompt Succor.

Our Lady of Prompt Succor assists those who pray to her with confidence. She protected the convent from a fire that destroyed much of the city in 1812, and assisted General Andrew Jackson's American army during their victory over a large British force in 1815.
