St. Francis de Sales (1567-1622)

His deep love of God and souls, gentle disposition, profound wisdom, and practical teaching method helped St. Francis de Sales, Bishop of Geneva, convert over 70,000 Protestants.

St. Francis de Sales and St. Jane Frances de Chantel founded the Order of the Visitation (Sisters) in 1610. His book: *The Introduction to the Devout Life* has inspired thousands.

Two of his famous sayings were: “If one must err, let it be on the side of gentleness,” and “More flies are caught with a spoonful of honey than with a hundred barrels of vinegar.”

St. John Bosco (1815-1888)

St. John Bosco was known for his unbounded trust in God, his joy and unbounded zeal for souls. No obstacle could thwart his work and he relied on Divine Providence to assist in matters that seemed humanly impossible.

Countless souls were saved through his work with young men. He schooled orphans, taught them trades and instructed them in the Faith so they could succeed. Once, when evil men tried to murder him, a huge dog appeared out of nowhere, protecting the saintly priest. It was believed it was his guardian angel. He founded the Salesians so priests and Sisters could continue his work.
