The Crowning with Thorns

Following the terrible scourging, Roman soldiers mocked Our Lord as a false king. They threw an old military cloak over His bloody shoulders, put a reed in His hands and made a crown for Him from nearby thorn bushes. Seating him on a bench, soldiers struck Him, spat in His Sacred Face and genuflected before Christ hailing Him, King of the Jews.

Sacred Scripture says that they took the reed and kept striking Him on the head causing the cap of thorns to cause intense, throbbing pain.

The crowning with thorns caused Jesus agonizing pain throughout His Passion, especially on the Cross since the large thorns caused terrible pain every time He moved His Sacred Head.

It is hard to fathom such cruelty, but we must remember that it was our sins that led the soldiers so mistreat Our Lord.

Remember that detraction, calumny, rash judgment, every prideful, uncharitable thought, and all impure thoughts caused these terrible sufferings. Realizing this, make every effort to avoid all sins of thought.
