Fast and Abstinence Laws

Abstinence

All Catholics over seven years of age are bound to observe the Church laws of abstinence. Complete abstinence is to be observed on Fridays, Ash Wednesday, Holy Saturday and the vigils of the Immaculate Conception and Christmas. On days of complete abstinence, meat and soup or gravy made from meat may not be used at all.

Partial abstinence is observed on Ember Wednesdays and Saturdays and on the vigil of Pentecost.

On days of partial abstinence, meat and soup made from meat may be taken only once a day at the principal meal.

Fast

All those who are 21 and under 59 are bound to observe the Church fast laws under pain of serious sin. Days of fast are the weekdays of Lent, Holy Saturday, Ember Days, and the Vigils of Pentecost, the Immaculate Conception and Christmas. On days of fast, only one full meal is allowed. Two other meatless meals sufficient to maintain strength may be taken according to one's needs; but together they should not equal another full meal.

Meat may be taken at the principal meal on a day of fast except on Fridays, Ash Wednesday and Holy Saturday and the Vigils of the Immaculate Conception and Christmas.

Eating between meals is not permitted but liquids including milk and fruit juice is allowed. Where health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige. In doubt concerning fast or abstinence, please consult your parish priest or confessor.
