## Honoring a Bishop

A bishop is given special honor because he is a successor of the Apostles. Bishops ordain priests, consecrate bishops and confer the Sacrament of Confirmation.

To show respect for the office of a bishop, one should genuflect on his or her **left** knee and kiss his ring.

The bishop's ring is kissed before receiving Holy Communion. The bishop presents his ring to you before the Host is placed on your tongue.

During a bishop's Mass, a special candle burns by the altar missal, *Dominus Vobiscum* is replaced with *Pax Vobis* before the Collect, there is an additional washing of the hands after Holy Communion and a special blessing is given by the bishop during Mass.

At least four candles are lit at a bishop's Mass. During solemn ceremonies, the bishop wears a miter on his head, carries a staff called a crosier and wears a pectoral cross that contains a relic. These are symbols of his office as a successor of one of the Apostles.
