Reflections on the Mysteries of the Rosary the Agony in the Garden

As grapes and olives are crushed in a press, so Our Lord was filled by sorrow and fear in the Garden of Gethsemane as He beheld the sins of the world and His Passion. Jesus endured terrible mental anguish that caused blood vessels to burst all over His Sacred Body, making His Precious Blood flow through His pores. It soaked His garments and flowed upon the ground, damaging His tissues and causing great pain.

His sadness and anxiety was so great that it could have caused death. Lying prostrate, He prayed that His Father remove the chalice of suffering from Him, yet, "Not My will, but Thine be done." It is important to remember that Christ, having a human nature like us, felt a natural aversion to suffering. Yet, even though Jesus knew what He would endure during His Passion and Death on the Cross, Our Lord chose to redeem us and open the Gates of Heaven.

St. Alphonsus wrote: "He truly suffered for us, more than all the penitents, all the anchorites, all the martyrs have suffered, because God laid upon Him the weight of a rigorous satisfaction to the Divine Justice for all the sins of man: the Lord laid on Him the iniquity of us all..."

Christ's greatest suffering was caused by the ingratitude of the millions who spurn His infinite, unconditional love and choose instead to suffer eternally in Hell. Apathy and ingratitude deeply wounded His Sacred Heart more than any other suffering.

Show gratitude and love for our Redeemer by living a virtuous life, being a light to the world and inspiring others to love God. If we help another get to Heaven, we will assuredly be there ourselves, if we persevere. Let us keep our eyes focused on Heaven, thinking of God's unbounded love and the evil of sin.
