“Man was created because God loved him. He was even given a share of the divine life. But man sinned, and because of that sin, ignorance, ... suffering and death became his lot. However, God still loved the world and its creatures and because He loved him, promised a Redeemer. ...By this death God was once more gloried in His creatures while man could now live in peace with his Creator. The perfect sacrifice of praise and expiation was now offered for all time. The intercession of Christ for mankind would continue until the last day and no individual would be excluded from eternal salvation except through his own fault.

From all this we can get some idea of the great joy which must have filled the Heart of Jesus and of Mary too, at that moment when, conscious of the fact that all the ancient prophecies concerning Him had been fulfilled. He could give up His human soul to God in an ecstasy of love and obedience for men the same joy should fill our hearts today, when we recall His death on the Cross. Because of it we are free men once again, sons of God and heirs to the kingdom prepared for us from the beginning of the world. What a debt of gratitude we owe to

Our Lord for such an act of supreme generosity and love! How do we repay Him for His love? We know that we have it in our power to render His death sterile in our own case. He came to destroy sin and its consequences, but we can still use our free will to impede the redemptive action of His grace in our lives and the lives of others.

We are redeemed; but it is vital that we should take full advantage of His love before it is too late. If we have been unfaithful in His service until now, at least today, ...we can renew our resolutions and our sorrow, determined that, from now on, we will allow Him to be our Savior.”
