Queenship of Mary

Pope Pius XII in the papal encyclical *Ad Coeli Reginam* explained the traditional Catholic teaching on the Queenship of Mary and established this feast for the universal Church.

Our Lady is the first of all creatures because she is the Mother of God. No one has had or can have a union with the Most Holy Trinity as close as hers. She is the Beloved Daughter of the Eternal Father, the Admirable Mother of the Son and the Faithful Spouse of the Holy Ghost.

Furthermore, she is Queen of Heaven and Earth and wields tremendous intercessory power with God as she pleads on our behalf.

The popes and saints call Mary the Mediatrix of All Graces since God has placed the graces He dispenses to mankind into her hands. This is depicted by the rays coming from Mary's hands in the Miraculous Medal.

St. Bernard called Mary the aqueduct and the neck of the Mystical Body of Christ through whom God's graces come to us.

Pope Pius XII added the following: "We command that on the festival there be renewed the consecration of the human race to the Immaculate Heart of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Upon this there is founded a great hope that soon we will rejoice in the triumph of religion and in Christian peace."
