Modesty—A Way of Life

At Baptism, our body and soul become a temple of the Holy Ghost. Modesty is a way of acting and dressing that calls to mind our sacred dignity of being a child of God.

Modest attire must be part of everyday life. Nothing should be worn at church or elsewhere by anyone: men, women, boys, or girls, that may be an occasion of sin to others. This includes garments that are too tight, too short, too revealing, or too low in the front or back.

The House of God is sacred. Women and girls need to wear a head covering (mantilla, hat, etc.) in church. Out of respect for Our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament, always dress modestly, especially in church.

Appropriate church attire for women and girls includes dresses or skirts that cover the knees when seated and modest coverage of the front and back. Large slits are inappropriate. Sleeveless garments and shorts are not to be worn in church by anyone. Pants are inappropriate for females in church.

Men and boys are encouraged to wear a suit and tie to church. During hot weather, they should dress appropriately. Jeans, casual attire and clothes with sports logo are inappropriate for attendance at church services.
